

## Projects > 'Let It Snow' Holiday Stocking

Add a personal touch to the holidays with this charming stocking!

### Materials and Supplies

- [Brother Sewing and Embroidery Machine](#)
- [Brother Embroidery Threads](#)
- [Brother Bobbin Thread](#)
- Feltscaper
- Commercial Christmas stocking pattern (Or draw your own)
- 1/2 yard fabric for front and back of stocking
- 1/2 yard fabric for lining.
- Brother Embroidery Card [#55](#) and [#28](#) (Or card of choice)
- Regular sewing thread to match the fabric.
- White wool roving or white yarn 3 ply or more.
- Tear-Away Stabilizer
- Cord or ribbon for hanging
- Fabric Marker
- **Optional:** *Interfacing (such as Easy Knit)*



### Instructions

1. Lay pattern on the fabric. Draw around the pattern. Do not cut out until the embroidery is finished.

**Note:** The house is from Brother Embroidery card [#55](#). The Santa/Snowman is from Brother Embroidery card [#28](#). Letter fonts are from the Brother [ULT2003D](#).

2. Using the Brother Embroidery cards and the built-in fonts, design the scene on screen of the machine.
3. Hoop the fabric with stabilizer and embroider the design.
4. Tear away the stabilizer.
5. Cut out the front, back of the stocking, as well as the cuff and lining.
6. Attach the Feltscaper to the sewing machine. Working from the wrong side of the fabric, place the roving or the yarn where the snow is to be. (Working from the wrong side of the fabric will produce a fuzzy look. Hence the snow appearance!)

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7. Using a fabric marker (a sliver of soap works great on dark fabric), mark dots indicating the snowflakes on the back of the cuff fabric. Again, working from the back of the fabric, use the wool roving or white yarn and the Feltscaper to create snowflakes!!
8. Sew the stocking right sides together. Turn right side out.
9. Sew the cuff together. Stitch to the top of the stocking leaving the raw edges on the top.
10. Place a loop of cord or ribbon at the corner for hanging. Machine baste in place.
11. Stitch the lining together leaving a large opening in the side seam for turning. Sew to the stocking with right sides together.
12. Turn through the opening. Slipstitch the opening closed.
13. Tuck the lining into the stocking.

**Hint:** *If the lining fabric is lightweight, iron on an interfacing such as Easy Knit to give it more body. Lightweight batting could also be used between the stocking fabric and lining for more stability.*
